Sam Bomar 2013 Scholarship Fund Requirements

The application and requirements for the 2013 Sam Bomar Memorial Scholarship are now posted at <u>www.sambomar.com</u>. The scholarship, a fund of West Tennessee Healthcare Foundation, was set up in memory of Samuel David Bomar (2/27/1992 – 5/4/2010). The Sam Bomar Scholarship Fund has granted scholarships and community service awards to 16 students.

One \$1000 scholarship will be awarded to a senior graduating from Madison Academic High School and one \$1000 scholarship will be awarded to a senior graduating from another high school located in Madison County, Tennessee. Primary consideration is given to students who have been involved in community oriented and service based groups and activities: church, scouts, theater, speech, debate, creative arts, volunteer work – not just students who hold memberships in a lot of clubs. Sam was involved with Madison's theater department and was on the debate team and the baseball team. He was also a student leader with Fellowship Bible Church's youth program and was a volunteer counselor at Lakeshore United Methodist Camp for three years.

The annual 5K Run/Walk to benefit the scholarship fund, will be held on Saturday, November 10, at Pringles Park. Registration is from 7 - 7:30 a.m., and the 5K will begin at 8:00. Pre-registration is available at <u>www.sambomar.com</u> and is encouraged.

The 5K was planned to coincide with Veterans Day because Sam was first and foremost a patriot. Sam was an Eagle Scout, and he loved his country. After the 5K and prior to the presentation of the medals, there will be a short patriotic program to honor our veterans. Sam's Scout Troop 115 and Troop 6 will be assisting. All veterans are invited to participate in the 5K and/or to attend the program so that all can say "thank you" for your service.
